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**3 Layers of Flannel  
Cut a bit larger  
than the size block you want**

**I used my Pfaff All fabric hoop for this quilt**



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Embroidery your design in each block  
this quilt I had 20 blocks you can have  
as many as you want and any size you want

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$4\frac{1}{2}$ " inner square

*Get Squared*<sup>™</sup>

trim all squares to the same size

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Mark a 3/4 inch border around each block

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Your border will look like this

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Cut your corners out  
This will be a corner Block

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Cut your corners out  
This will be a side block

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**Cut your corners out  
This will be a center blocks**



Lay your blocks out  
how you want them to be in the quilt




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Sew your blocks together in strips  
Good sides out

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
Your first row  
I started at the bottom row



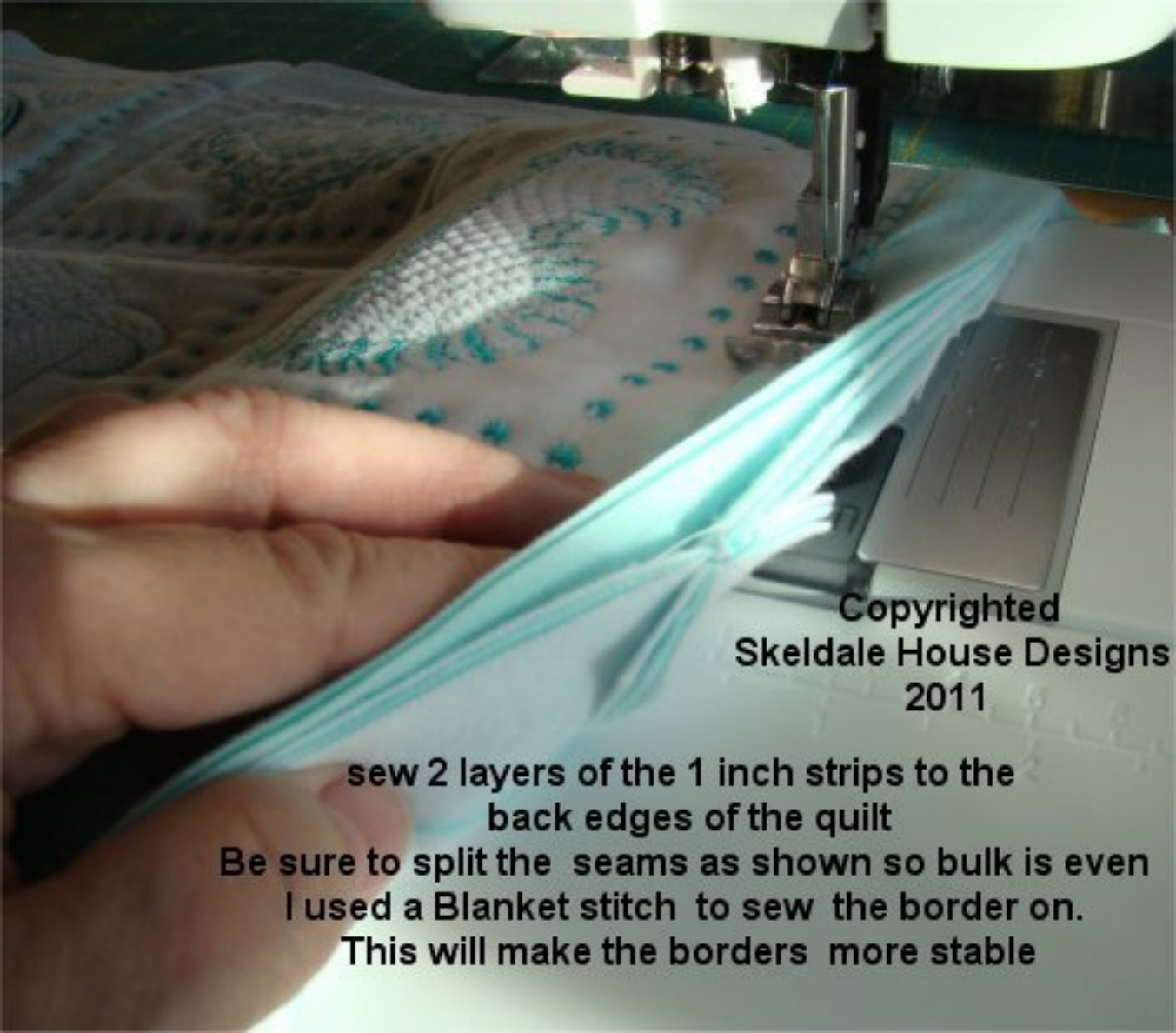
**Sewing the rows together.  
I double stitch over the joins**

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Cut "8" 1 inch strips for the border backing  
2 strips for each side



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sew 2 layers of the 1 inch strips to the  
back edges of the quilt  
Be sure to split the seams as shown so bulk is even  
I used a Blanket stitch to sew the border on.  
This will make the borders more stable

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All that is left is for you to cut the ragging
